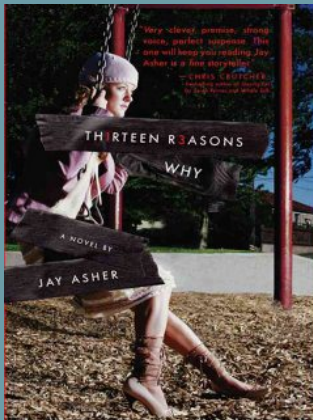


Book. Fiction. **BeLoved** (Toni Morrison). Challenged because of violence, language, sex, racism, bestiality.

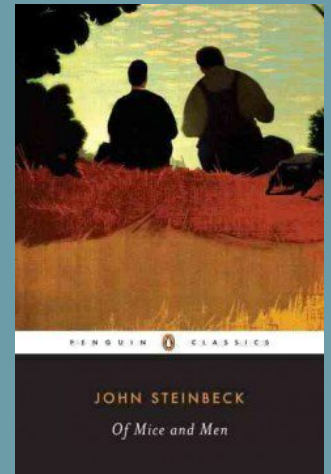

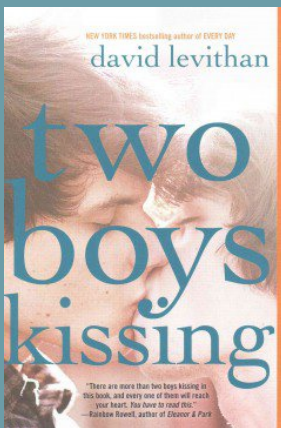

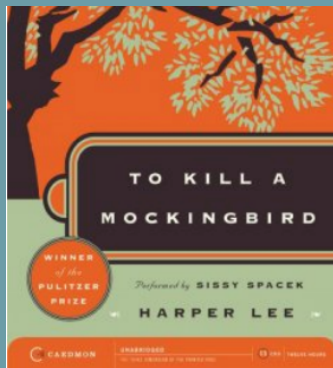
Book. Fiction. **The Handmaid's Tale** (Margaret Atwood). Challenged because of profanity and for "vulgarity and sexual overtones."



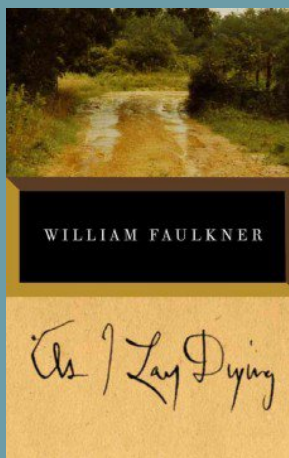
Book. **Of Mice and Men** (John Steinbeck). Challenged for profanity, vulgar language, and "using God's name in vain."



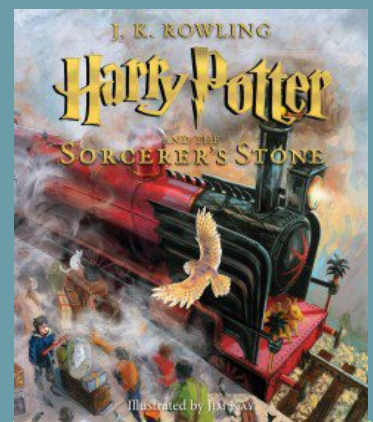
Book. Fiction. **two boys kissing** (David Levithan). Challenged for including LGBTQIA+ content.



Audiobook. Fiction. **To Kill a Mockingbird** (Harper Lee). Challenged because of violence and its use of the N-word.



Book. Fiction. **As I Lay Dying** (William Faulkner). Challenged because of profanity, masturbation, and because it questions the existence of God.



Book. Fiction. **Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone** (J.K. Rowling). Along with the entire **Harry Potter series**, challenged for containing actual curses and spells, and because of characters who use "nefarious means" to attain goals.
